What is the process of becoming an Ambassador?

You can become an Ambassador in 5 easy steps if you:

- Commit to becoming an Apprenticeship Information Ambassador
- Are a training provider delivering in London.
- Are a member of the London Work Based Learning Alliance
- You have been subject to an Ofsted Inspection and received a grade 1 or 2 for the over all effectiveness of provision
- You will also be Matrix accredited which is the industry 'standard' to offer an IAG service



What do we expect of an Apprenticeship Information Ambassador?

Apprenticeship Information Ambassadors provide this service on a voluntary basis. The AIAN is a free service providing general impartial information including:
